

## Lesson 32 – Nobody Knows You When You’re Down And Out (DVD 8, CD 2 Tracks 18 and 19)

Another classic standard tune that’s not really a blues... but is certainly “bluesy.” Ideally you would sing along with this one as this is not a solo arrangement.

Instead we’ll take the opportunity to use rhythmic notation and just work with chord diagrams and a strum pattern to put the song together. If you can’t sing it find a buddy and have a jam session!
